## Process for Flagging Eligibility Status of Locations

The State has posted the list of BEAD-eligible locations on the NDIT website. Please review locations and identify those that no longer need service, based on the criteria below:

#### **Acceptable Reason Codes for Flagging Eligibility Status of Locations**

- Location should not have a broadband connection (i.e. location has been demolished, is not habitable, is not a building, etc.)
- Location does not need mass-market broadband service due to the nature of use (i.e. enterprise location or government building)
- Location has been removed from the latest version of the fabric data from the FCC
- Location is already served by an enforceable commitment
- Location is already served by non-subsidized service (privately funded network)

Compile and email Excel file of **location IDs** that may no longer need service to the State Broadband Program Office (SBPO)

# Broadband Equity, Access, And Deployment (BEAD) Program Overview

BEAD provides funding to eligible entities and territories for broadband planning, deployment, mapping, and adoption activities, with the primary purpose of expanding high-speed internet access.

#### **Eligible Activities**

- Deploy broadband service to unserved locations and underserved locations
- Ensure deployment of gigabit connections to community anchor institutions (e.g., schools, hospitals, libraries)
- Remaining funds can support access, adoption, and equity-related uses

## Overview of BEAD application requirements

## **BEAD Application** *Initial Round: 11/22/2024 – 1/17/2025*

The BEAD Application will request information required by the NTIA BEAD NOFO.

ND SBPO does <u>not</u> have the authority to amend information required by the BEAD NOFO to complete the BEAD Application. The application is broken down into 13 sections in WebGrants that address project, applicant, and compliance requirements:

- I. Applicant Information: Information about the applicant (Contact, State Business Registration, etc.)
- II. Project Information: Information about the project(s) (Area, Design, Pricing, Cost Schedule, etc.)
- **III. Compliance:** Evidence and attestations of compliance with Federal requirements

(Cybersecurity/Supply Chain Risk, Labor standards, Build America Buy America, Environmental/Historical Preservation, etc.)

You will be able to copy over required information related to **Applicant Information** and **Compliance** to other applications, so this information can be provided just once across multiple projects

## NTIA Requirements Crosswalk

Documents requested throughout the North Dakota BEAD Application are required by the NTIA BEAD NOFO. *ND SBPO does not have the authority to amend the information required*. For further information, ND SBPO has provided a link to the relevant section of the NTIA BEAD NOFO that details each documentation requirement.

## BEAD Application – Project Information

The BEAD Program prioritizes projects designed to provide fiber connectivity directly to the end user.

Internet Service Providers are encouraged to leverage their understanding of their service boundaries to define their own project areas and submit applications for both **Priority Broadband Projects** and **Other Last-Mile Projects**<sup>1</sup>.



**Priority Broadband Projects:** a project that will provision service via end-to-end fiberoptic facilities to each end-user premises.



Other Last Mile Projects: a project that provides services to the end-user through a reliable broadband service (RBS)<sup>2</sup> hybrid of fiber and other RBS technology, or solely any RBS technology other than fiber.

Applicants will **submit** information for **each project** for the following sections

#### II. Project Information

- 2. Project Overview (Project Name, Project Description, Project Priority by Technology, Speeds, Permits, Letters of Tribal Consent)
- **3. Project Area and Design**<sup>3</sup> (Service and Network Design, Project Area, Proposed Route Miles)
- **4. Service Pricing** (Service pricing, Low-cost service option)
- **5. Project Cost & Match**<sup>3</sup> (Total funding cost/match, total project cost, project cost breakdown, capital investment schedule)
- 6. Project Timeline<sup>3</sup>


### What version of federal fabric data was used?

NTIA V3 Fabric Data (Update 2) was initially used and then challenge process findings were re-adjudicated using NTIA V4 Fabric Data

#### **NTIA Tier D License**

Providers that plan to submit an application for BEAD funds need to obtain an **NTIA Tier D License from CostQuest**, which will allow ISPs to view the **latitude/longitude** for each location. *To request a license:* 

- 1. Go to <a href="https://apps.costquest.com/ntiarequest/">https://apps.costquest.com/ntiarequest/</a>
- 2. Confirm that you have an FRN and contact details for the account
- 3. Enter basic organizational information
- 4. Follow emailed link to input detailed organizational information and information on federal programs
- 5. Submit and follow emailed account creation steps
